The Camosun Campus Organizer will be responsible for implementing the goBeyond Project at both the Landsdown and Interurban campuses over the 2010 academic year (winter and spring terms). The ideal candidate is a strong, motivated, inspired and knowledgeable full-time or part-time student leader, an active member of the campus community, and passionate about the issues and solutions surrounding climate change and sustainability.

#### Project Partner Overview:

goBEYOND is a youth-led project, which works to educate, inspire, engage and support our peers in taking climate action at British Columbia's colleges and universities. We believe our campuses can goBEYOND climate-neutral by taking responsibility for social and ecological impacts while taking the opportunity to create climate change solutions for our communities.

These goals are achieved through the following four project pillars:

- Training: Increasing the ability of students and youth organizations to do this work by providing relevant skills training, accessible toolkits, and mentorship
- Planning: Creating space for youth to lead their institutions in collaboratively planning a low-carbon future.

3. Building or working with an existing student group of volunteers to implement goBeyond programming
4. Helping promote the goBeyond Campus Climate Network on campus and at relevant community events
5. Attending regular staff calls and maintaining active lines of communication with staff working throughout the province
6. Submitting bi-weekly blogs to the goBEYOND website
7. Work with other goBeyond campus organizers in your region to organize at least one training workshop / summit per semester.
